





Statement 5. CM-CM. The fifth statement of the text functions like a coda. It is set homophonically, in parallel sixths and octaves to suggest sweet and complete union of the believer and Jesus (unio mystica).









The text is reminiscent of the day's Gospel and Epistle readings (see above), but also to D(7) G minor A major biblical passages such as Psalm 144:3–4. O Lord, what is man that thou dost regard him, or the son of man that thou dost think of him: Man is like a breath, his days are like a passing shadow; Psalm 103:14. [God] knows our frame; he remembers that we are dust; Ecclesiastes 2:23. All [man's] days are full of pain, and his work is a vexation..."








