



- L For a continual sense of your abiding presence and your overruling guidance in our daily life,




• For the illuminating grace of the Holy Spirit, that we may be guided to use wisely every power and every opportunity you give us,

• For the right understanding and use of the means of grace, so that we, having been washed in living water, may grow in grace and hunger for righteousness,




• For a deep indwelling of the Holy Spirit, that we may be taught to truly live for others, calling them to the life-giving waters of the font,

David Hurd is widely recognized as one of the foremost church musicians and concert organists in the United States, with a long list of awards, prizes, honors, and achievements, and immeasurable expertise in organ performance, improvisation, and composition. He is the composer of dozens of hymns, choral works, settings of the liturgy, and organ works published by a number of major houses. From 1998-2013 he was Music Director and Organist at Church of the Holy Apostles (Episcopal) in New York City. Dr. Hurd is now Organist/Choirmaster of the famed Church of St. Mary the Virgin at Times Square.

David will play a program of eclectic music with improvisations.
