Welcome to the Seventh Bach Festival promoted by the Chantry Singers and the fourteenth to be held in the City of Bath. The first Festival was the inspiration of Cuthbert Bates, founder of the City of Bath Bach Choir, and took place in 1950 to mark the bicentenary of the death of JS Bach.

Cuthbert died in 1980 and so it

appeared that Bach Festivals had died with him. But in 1995 I felt that with the backing of my choir, the Chantry Singers, we were in a position to re-establish these wonderful occasions. Was a gap of almost 18 years too long for a resurgence? Apparently not.

Each Festival has had its own particular slant whilst focussing almost entirely on the music of JS Bach. For this, the last Bach Festival I will present with the choir, I have endeavoured once again to put together a programme which will give the listener joy and spiritual insight into the astonishing mind and musical genius of Johann Sebastian Bach.

As you look through the brochure you will find an abundance of choice. The great choral and instrumental works are interspersed with solo recitals, showing Bach's more intimate side. The artists engaged are amongst the most talented and admired of their generations. For our family audience we welcome the return of the Classic Buskers: this concert is a must for anyone between the ages of 3 and 103.

The bedrock of all these Festivals is the choir itself, which seldom numbers more than 50. The load of each Festival has been carried by a remarkable team of people who have all given of their time and energy simply for the love of it. I would like to thank all those who have enabled me to realise a dream. Not only have Bach Festivals given great enjoyment to the choir and to me, but many hundreds of people who have visited Bath over the years have delighted in their 'Bach Experience'.

Whether you are a returning or first time visitor - local, national or international - I look forward to your company in October and assure you of a warm welcome.



This is a coming together of two of the most appreciated contemporary names in Baroque music. *Emma Kirkby's* unique voice and her brilliant performing technique make each of her concerts an unforgettable experience. In this performance she sings two of Bach's most beautiful solo cantatas in the company of *London Baroque*,

with whom she has enjoyed a long and highly successful performing partnership.

The Suite No. 2 provides compelling evidence that Bach was master of a lighter style of music making, even though it seems possible that he did not like it much! The Concerto in D was adapted from the violin score and transposed down a tone, and will give *London Baroque* the opportunity to demonstrate what the Financial Times described as "supple, flexible playing which touched the heights of virtuosity and the depths of emotion."

Ashley Solomon and Terence Charlston were recently described by Fanfare as "a winning combination". The Sunday Star Times (NZ) said: "the musicians are precise in phrasing and ensemble and Solomon plays with marvellous flexibility".

They will play work from three of the most remarkable baroque composers writing for flute and harpsichord in

the 18th century - namely J S Bach; his most influential son Carl Philipp Emanuel Bach; and CPE's godfather, Telemann. The programme highlights three textures of baroque flute music - the solo sonata, the obbligato sonata and the unaccompanied flute, and this will give full reign to the warmth of Solomon's baroque flute, and the dazzling quality of the sound.

John Amis wrote in a recent review "Dame Gillian is surely one of the greatest of living artists; her playing shows a perfect mixture of head and heart, a true musician with the technique to tackle anything."

Bach's more reflective side is the territory for this exposition. Dame

Gillian will particularly use the palette of subtler sounds from ranks of flutes and reeds on the mighty Klais organ of Bath Abbey. Her recital ends with one of the most splendid of all the great preludes and fugues. In her own words: 'this fugue sounds like a great golden gondola sailing through the skies until it docks at the gates of heaven'.

Jakob Lindberg divides his time between Sweden and the UK, but also gives recitals in many parts of Europe, Japan, Mexico, Russia, Australia, Canada and the USA. It is particularly through his live solo performances that he has become known as one of the finest lutenists in the world, prompting *The International Record Review* to comment that



'...lindberg is able to achieve what every lutenist aspires to but seldom manages - a true, smooth, flowing legato, in which every strand of the music remains absolutely clear'.

During Bach's lifetime the lute was still held in high esteem. Although Bach did not play the instrument himself, he loved its unique sound and we know that there are tabulatures of the repertoire written out by lutenists contemporary with Bach. From this we can deduce that the music was played during Bach's life time on the "ideal" instrument, the lute. In addition to three works by J S Bach the concert also includes pieces by three other northern European composers for the lute.

The Academy of Ancient Music will perform all six Brandenburg Concertos as the centrepiece of our Bach Festival week. When the AAM toured the USA in 2009 with these works, the performances led one critic to exclaim "They blow centuries of library dust off these pieces, and they blow fantastic horn and trumpet lines". After this tour and the acclaimed recording which followed it, the AAM and Music Director Richard Egarr return to these much-loved masterpieces in a series of UK concerts. BBC Music Magazine described the AAM as "peerless" (January 2010), and said that "...as the six concertos unfolded, there was no sense of let-down, just continuing pleasant surprises..."

When in 1721 Bach presented the Margrave of Brandenburg with a bound manuscript containing these highly individual concertos, he was neither thanked nor even paid! Now who remembers the Margrave, except through Bach's enduring music?

'Peter O'Hagan is a formidable scholar-pianist' said Bayan Northcott in *The Independent*. We are delighted that Dr O'Hagan, a regular visitor to Bath, is to make a welcome return for this intriguing recital. He has been a skilful and sensitive accompanist at the Chantry Singers' Christmas concerts in the Pump Room, and has performed as soloist in previous Bach Festivals.

His performance of the Goldberg Variations in 2000 was, by common agreement, masterly. A recent recording of Peter playing works by other composers was described as 'a tour de

force of intelligent virtuosity'. This virtuosity encompasses music of both the contemporary and the traditional repertoires.

Some scholars feel that the influence of Italian and French composers on the music of Bach has been underestimated, and this recital promises to provide supporting evidence.

As well as being a solo violinist of international standing, Ruth Waterman is a master of the spoken and written word. She combines these talents for us here by preceding her concert performance of two Bach Sonatas with a lively and

illuminating exploration of the works as she takes the audience "beyond the notes" into aspects of composition and interpretation.

In the company of Florian Uhlig, himself a distinguished solo keyboard player, Ruth Waterman will demonstrate why *Fanfare Record Review* in the United States, where Ruth has spent much of her career, said that 'Waterman is an experience no Bach-lover should miss'.

Ruth Waterman's early career included the Bath Festival with Yehudi Menuhin. The *Gramophone* magazine, in a review of her recording of Bach Sonatas, referred to the 'intensely felt but never heavy-handed lyricism' and said: '...of all the recent recordings of this wonderful music, this is the first one that has made me want to go back and play the pieces for myself'.

David Briggs' engagement book is filled with concerts for the next eighteen months, such is his reputation as one of the most thrilling talents of his generation. As a performer, and increasingly for his orchestral transcriptions and improvisation, he has won awards and glowing reviews for his musicality, virtuosity and ability to excite and engage audiences of all ages. No one who was present at David's

recital in Bath Abbey as part of our last Bach Festival in 2008 will forget his brilliant improvisation on Bach themes.

As the title suggests, Bach was to have great influence on future generations of composers, and the improvisations and compositions of David Briggs follow the tradition of innovation and creativity set by Bach. In this concert David will provide illustrations of the threads which connect Bach to composers of the 19th and 20th centuries.

Dr Peter Seymour

The Role and Importance of Ornamentation in Bach's Music.



Johann Sebastian Bach's pre-eminent place in the history of western music means that he continues to stimulate and intrigue academics as well as performers and audiences.

One aspect of Bach's music to which few performers or listeners have devoted much time is the use of ornamentation, but it was one of the most important expressive tools of the Baroque, its primary purpose being to clarify what the music was about. Peter Seymour's illustrated lecture sets

the historical context and shows how Bach uses ornamentation and expects it of his interpreters.

Peter Seymour is Professor in Music and Organist at the University of York, as well as being a conductor and keyboard

soloist. He has worked with a distinguished list of leading performers of Baroque music over many years, including Lynne Dawson, Thomas Guthrie, Emma Kirkby, Yvonne Seymour, David Thomas, Stephen Varcoe, James Gilchrist and Robin Blaze.

The Mass in B Minor seems to be a summation of every contribution that Bach made to music, and has come to be regarded as one of the supreme achievements of musical expression. Bach assembled the Mass towards the end of his life and probably never lived to hear it performed in its entirety. Can there be a more appropriate way to end this week of music, dedicated to its composer?

The Chantry Singers' reputation has grown with the years since its formation in 1980, and a *Bath Chronicle* review of their 2010 performance of the Monteverdi Vespers said that they "...rose to the occasion with some outstanding singing, expansive and hushed, dramatic and reverent as this multi-faceted writing requires..."

With such a distinguished group

of musicians joining the choir to perform the Mass, it will bring to a moving finale not only this Festival, but all Bach Festivals promoted by Cuthbert Bates, his daughter Elizabeth, and the Chantry Singers in the City of Bath since 1950.


