Bach's Lunch 30th Anniversary at Starmount

March 17 – 21, 2014 will celebrate 30 years of Starmount Presbyterian Church bringing great music and luncheon to the Piedmont Triad. This is a gift to our community and each year hundreds embrace this Starmount offering by enjoying the music, food and fellowship.

Starmount's Bach's Lunch series was conceived in 1985 by then music director Loretta Gordon James. Originally, the series featured mostly organists but quickly evolved into a forum for other instrumentalists and vocalists as well.

Let me begin with a few fast facts:

- Families comprise nearly 40% of all who are homeless.
- 68% of the cities reporting in the 2010 Mayor's Report, had to turn away homeless families with children because of a lack of available shelter beds.
- Among families who are homeless with children, the majority cited loss of a job as the cause, followed by the lack of affordable housing, poverty, lowpaying jobs and domestic violence.
- 42% of homeless children are under the age of 6.
- A child is born into poverty every 33 seconds.
- Families with children comprise one of the fastest-growing segments of the homeless population today.

Session has agreed for Starmount to be certified as a 150-day temporary night shelter and to partner with Family Promise to begin addressing the needs of homeless families in our community. 

Meet Cindy Lee, Director of Starmount's Weekday Preschool

She is the owner of the warm, welcoming smile greeting you when you visit Starmount's Preschool.



As a bit of a "This is Your Life" synopsis of Cindy and her family:

She was born in Clinton, Iowa, as the youngest of six children and moved to Fort Lauderdale, Florida when she was nine. She attended Catawba College on a full Tennis Scholarship and played both tennis and volleyball during her tenure at the school. She majored in Early Childhood Education and Therapeutic Recreation. Cindy and her husband Scott are looking forward to celebrating their 24th wedding anniversary this May. They have one daughter, Meghan, who is 15 and a sophomore at Grimsley High School. Meghan has followed closely in her mother's footsteps: she is a member of the Grimsley tennis team and loves working with kids.

Cindy's work experience through the years has been varied and exciting. Cindy has spent almost her whole career working with children, whether in the classroom setting or while working in children's ministry, planning family events and camps for all ages. Some highlights of her 30 year career include: After finishing college she worked in the Salisbury City School System with emotionally disturbed children as well as year round with Salisbury's Recreation Department, planning events for children from Preschool through 5th grade.

Cindy also spent a stint of time working as a Recreational Therapist in the nursing unit at Friends Home - Guilford.

While working at Westover Church as part of their children's ministry team, she was in charge of all family events such as Vacation Bible School, the Fall Festival, and their summer camps.

During her time with Starmount Preschool, she spent 2 years in the classroom with the two and three-year-old classes before becoming the Preschool's director in 2008.

When work and family are not claiming her time, Cindy enjoys playing tennis and doing a number of crafts, including stamping cards and scrapbooking. She really enjoys making things for the preschool staff and committee members.

Cindy's volunteer work also reflects her love for working with people. She has coached Special Olympics athletes in Tennis, and Track and Field. While working with the Parks and Recreation Department, she taught tennis lessons and continues to share her knowledge of the game by serving as a Parent Coach for Grimsley's Girls' Tennis Team for the past two years. She also shares her Early Childhood Education background by teaching workshops for other preschool teachers for many years. 

John Odom Invited to be a Thompson Scholar at Columbia Theological Seminary

Pastor John has been selected as one of 15 clergy throughout the country to participate in the Thompson Scholars program, "A Different World: Evangelism for the Screen Share Generation," held on the seminary's campus, April 29 – May 2. The program is directed by Ralph Watkins, Associate Professor of Evangelism and Church Growth.

Recognizing that the number one device in the world today is the cell phone, Thompson Scholars will be challenged to answer the question: How do we share the gospel with a generation that lives through a mobile device?

The seminar will focus on defining the new world in which people of faith live and how we share the gospel with a generation that lives via the small screen. Scholars will look at the generation some call "the screen share generation" and consider how it is that the Church might effectively build relationships and foster discipleship with them from the virtual world to the face to face world.

<u>Christians in the Movies, A Century of Saints and Sinners</u> by Peter Dans. This is "a mini-history of




American movies in general, from the days of silent films to the censorship, the Motion Picture Production Code, and the National Legion of Decency, through the decades to the present.


