Michaelmas Term 2022

**W**elcome to New College Chapel, where worship has been offered since the late fourteenth century. We hope you will find peace and space for reflection in this beautiful building, built to the glory of God and designed to resound with music and words of praise.

The choristers and clerks sing together on Sundays, Tuesdays, Fridays and Saturdays, except in half term; the clerks sing Evensong on Mondays, and the choristers a form of Vespers (the Benedictine evening office) on Thursdays. On alternate Tuesdays there is a short service of Compline at 9.00 pm.

Our customary service of Vespers with a Cantata takes place this term on Sunday of Second Week, 16 October, featuring Bach's pastoral setting *Herr Christ der einge Gottessohn*, BWV 96. There is Solemn Sung Eucharist for All Souls on Saturday 29 October, when the choir will sing Ildebrando Pizzetti's setting of the Requiem. The following day (Sunday 30 October) we will celebrate our College Commemoration service, with a sermon by the Warden on the theme of diversity.

The annual carol services for Advent and Christmas will take place on 27 November and 3 December; all college members are welcome. Information on booking tickets will be sent by email early in November.

We will celebrate the 150th anniversary of the birth of Ralph Vaughan Williams at the Eucharist on Saturday 12 November, when the choir will sing his *Mass in G minor*. The choir will also participate in Music at Oxford's Arvo Pärt Festival in November, offering Pärt's *Da pacem Domine* and *The Beatitudes* at Evensong on St Cecilia's day, 22 November.

There are weekly organ recitals on Thursdays at 1.15pm. We are delighted to welcome visiting players from the Cathedrals of Gloucester and Ely, and concert organists William Whitehead, Hilary Punnett, and David Goode.

Auditions for the next cohort of choristers take place on 10 January 2023. Interested families with sons in Year 2 are encouraged to contact the Choir Administrator ([nancy-jane.rucker@new.ox.ac.uk](mailto:nancy-jane.rucker@new.ox.ac.uk)). As always, the Organist is happy to hear from anyone considering a choristership for their son, or an Academical Clerkship (undergraduate choral scholarship) at any time.
